Water is the climate challenge and it poses a major risk for the water security of the citizens of India. The Challenge varies across States and is eliciting a wide range of responses from the stakeholders at different levels. Unfortunately there is no structural framework of sharing knowledge on the water challenges as well as the problem solving experiences of utilities across the country. In this context the UN General Assembly has mandated the UN agencies to form United Nations Global Water Operators Partnerships (UN-GWOPA). In the context of climate change and challenge to meet MDGs, it is intended to initiate a knowledgesharing and founding conference-cum-workshop on January 6<sup>th</sup> and 7<sup>th</sup>, 2011 at Chennai, India.

The conference aims to establish a Water Organizations Partnerships platform to help and share problem solving knowledge amongst the various Water organizations, utilities, departments and stakeholders of India.

The conference is organized by the Centre of Excellence for Change (CEC) along with UNICEF India & support of the World Bank assisted TN-IAMWARM Project GoTN & GoI.


