Vision

The marginalised sections (women, tribals, Dalits and other resource poor) among forest dwelling and dependent people manage and utilise forest and other resources sustainably with due regard to conservation of biodiversity and attain livelihood security through skill diversification.

Mission

Promoting capacities, diversifying skills and enhancing livelihood security of the marginalised sections among forest dwelling and dependent communities.





Centre for People's Forestry is a Civil Society Organisation established in August 2002. Prior to that, CPF functioned as an autonomous wing within Centre for World Solidarity. CPF works for the rights and livelihoods of forest dependent communities with due regard to conservation. It believes that the claim to conservation, control and management of the forest resources belong to the forest dwelling and dependent communities and their livelihoods should be the primary concern of all forestry programmes.CPF operates around three core programmes: Participatory Forest Management, Sustainable Livelihoods and Policy Advocacy. Gender is the cross cutting theme and Information Exchange and Communication is an overarching function.

In working with forest and forest-based livelihoods for about a decade, CPF gained vast experience and knowledge on the subject. CPF has been sharing this knowledge and experience through trainings and capacity building programmes, on request, from time to time. As the demand for trainings is augmenting it has now been decided to have the current round-the-year training programmes. The trainings are intended for NGOs, representatives of CBOs and their networks as well as field officials of forest and other line departments associated with community/ participatory forest management. Special trainings can also be arranged for managers of government schemes and externally-aided projects. The types of training programmes include scheduled trainings with or without field visits, customised trainings to suit to the perceived needs of the organizations/projects, on-site trainings and organisational support trainings.
