Amritmahal Kavals are traditional grazing pastures in the Deccan Plains of Karnataka. These common lands are rooted in a culture that encompasses the land, water, livestock, and people of the landscape. Thousands of communities that practise animal husbandry, especially sheep rearing for their livelihoods have depended on these Kavals. Among them, Dalits and nomadic tribes are especially dependent on these lands. The lives, cultures, occupation and animal husbandry practices of these communities are tightly interlinked with the biodiversity of the Kavals. Due to the deep sense of ownership and belongingness, these dependent communities believe that protecting these lands is their tradition. Consequently, these grazing lands have also been home to several unique and endangered flora and fauna.

Ignoring these facts, the State has gone amok in diverting these lands in the name of development. Amritmahal Kavals, which have served as common lands are therefore, now fast disappearing. These diversions to the industries are taking place without the consent of the communities that have depended, nurtured and protected the Kavals. However, this authoritarian culture has been a subject of debate, discussion and even dissent among the affected people and concerned citizens. Given these circumstances, there is need for deliberation on these unique common lands, their importance and current conditions, livelihoods of dependent communities, the future of livestock rearing and the need for legal battles, grassroots movements. This event is a step towards informing public opinion through conversations and debates by progressive thinkers and decision-makers.
