Certificate Course MicroFinance and Rural Livelihood CmF, Jaipur Dec 2012- March 2013

The availability of skilled work force ready to work at grass-roots is vital for the growth of any rural livelihood and development program. But, we have experienced that most of us are facing rarity of grassroots field workers and managers who can work directly with community. Whilst there are many youths in villages who have talent but are unemployed due to lack proper education, skill and guidance.

It is with the above realization Centre for micro Finance (CmF), Jaipur has taken an effort to prepare the required skilled human resource by pioneering a four months Certificate Course in MicroFinance and Rural Livelihood.

This is an effort to lessen the scarcity of skilled rural development work force and at the same time it will help to unemployed youth in getting a respectful job in rural sector and near to their city. On the successful completion of the course, students would be able to work on promotion and nurturing of SHGs & community institutions, bank linkages, microfinance, credit and livelihood planning, agriculture, dairy and small ruminant based livelihood etc.

The first five batches of the certificate course have been successful and most of the students enrolled in the programme have been employed by various NGO's, MFIs and Banks. Encouraged with this success CmF, Centre for microFinance, Jaipur is glad to announce the commencement of the sixth batch of the Certificate Course from 1st December 2012. There will be two months classroom session and 45 days field work with any leading development organization. The tuition fee of the course is kept at affordable level of Rs. 20,000/- (excluding food and hostel charges).
