Sanitation situation in India depicts a very grim picture. About 30 million people in urban India do not have adequate sanitation facilities. Adding to the criticality of problem is the fact that as high as 70% of the wastewater generated in urban areas is not treated. Realising the vastness and implications of this serious environmental and socio economic issue, the Ministry of Urban Development, Government of India (GoI) announced the National Urban Sanitation Policy (NUSP) in December 2008. As directed by the policy, cities need to prepare City Sanitation Plans (CSPs) addressing all aspects of sanitation in the city.

Although efforts are being made, the centralised systems of wastewater and solid waste treatment may not address every need of the city due to various barriers and limitations. Therefore, decentralised basic needs services (DBNS) could be an effective approach to ensure wider coverage and achieve the overall objective of safe health and adequate sanitation facilities for all.

### Citywide Sanitation Planning (CSP)

In order to deal with the issues that are leading to gaps in sanitation services and sub-standard sanitation infrastructure, a strong planning framework is recommended. CSP as a tool helps in identifying the needs of the 'unserved' and poor population of urban areas.

Therefore, CDD Society offers a methodology to carry out a Citywide Sanitation Plan with different decentralised sanitation options and integration with centralised systems in small and medium towns. It is a holistic approach and gives both long term solutions (e.g. policy initiatives for new developments in sanitation infrastructure) and short term solutions to fill sanitation gaps. CDD Society's Citywide Sanitation Planning service is a participatory approach for improving sanitation infrastructure and livelihoods in poorer urban areas.

Graduates in Civil Engineering or Architecture. At least 2 years of work experience in Urban Planning, Urban Development or Urban governance.
