

Eligibility

The YIF programme is open to all Indian citizens with:

- A recognised undergraduate or postgraduate degree
- No more than two years of work experience

The Fellowship promotes diversity and applicants from all areas of specialisation are encouraged to apply. While applicants who have been educated with a vernacular language as their medium of instruction are welcome, it is expected that they will be able to converse, read and write in English.

Selection criteria

Young India Fellowship applicants will be evaluated on a combination of demonstrated talent in the domain of their interest and a passion for learning beyond the prescribed curriculum. An above-average academic record, both at the school and college level, and involvement and achievement in extra-curricular activities is essential. The evaluation process will include personal interviews, group discussions and team activities.

Cost and scholarship details

The Fellowship covers, in full or in part, the following:

- Tuition fees and all material including text books towards all academic instruction
- Boarding and fully furnished lodging

My dear Fellows,

I know it is a trifle unusual for a teacher to write in this manner to his students. But I decided to write because I have been overwhelmed and profoundly touched by your words at the end of the course. Right through my flight back to Calcutta I felt this glow of happiness which I know came from the indulgence that all of you - individually and collectively - showered upon me.


